Royal Institute of British Architects published a book **ERIC LYONS AND SPAN** to accompany the 2006/2007 exhibition of the same name.

This is a hardback book lavishly illustrated and covering the whole of the Lyons/Span buildings - 240 pages. There is a chapter by Patrick Ellard, **NEW ASH GREEN: SPAN'S "LATTER 20TH CENTURY VILLAGE IN KENT"**.
